AMCP: Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy

The Academy of Managed Care Pharmacy is the national professional association of pharmacists and other healthcare practitioners who serve society by the application of sound medication management principles and strategies to improve healthcare for all. The Academy's 5,700 members develop and provide a diversified range of clinical, educational, and business management services and strategies on behalf of the more than 200 million Americans covered by a managed care pharmacy benefit.

Student chapter of AMCP at Pitt aims to promote the managed care pharmacy as a non-traditional route for student pharmacists who are interested in optimizing cost-effective medication therapies for patients, and better pharmacoeconomic outcomes for the healthcare industry. By hosting guest speakers from multiple insurance plans and managed care residency programs, student pharmacists will have the opportunity to immerse themselves in the field and network with the professionals.

During the fall semester 2023, AMCP is mainly focused on promoting the annual Pharmacy and Therapeutics (P&T) Competition to all student pharmacists who are interested in managed care pharmacy or any related functional areas. Annul P&T competition is designed to provide an immersive experience in the skills necessary for effective formulary review and management. Student pharmacists usually work together in a team of 4 as if they are preparing for — and presenting to — a mock P&T Committee.

The University of Pittsburgh AMCP chapter will send out information for team formation this semester. The competition begins in the chapter level during the winter break, and the winner will submit their materials and may qualify to compete on the national level at the AMCP annual meeting. An entry to the National P&T Competition typically consists of (1) a written drug monograph evaluating the competition study drug, with recommendations for formulary placement and any associated utilization management strategies; and (2) narrated PowerPoint slides for a P&T Committee presentation. Preparing an entry involves extensive research into the clinical, humanistic, and pharmacoeconomic evidence supporting the value proposition of the study drug(s).
